

Pitch to students starting LITERACY

At the first session before your student starts, pitch him or her on Literacy overall. Then, **after each exercise** is complete, explain how that exercise can help.

FAST FORWARD LITERACY

"This program exercises your brain. If you shoot baskets every day you would improve quickly. This is a work out for the brain that will make school and homework easier:

- Reading will seem easier and more fun.
- Homework will take less time.
- School day will be more fun and productive – listening to the teacher will be easier
- You will most likely get higher test or SAT scores.

You do want these things right? To change your brain though, you need to give us your best effort every day and try to beat the point scores from the day before. If you do that you will do great!"

SPACE RACER

It speeds up your brain so you can listen faster and more accurately. That will help: (pick out what applies)

1. Follow the teacher easier because you will be hearing faster.
2. Read easier because you will be thinking faster.
3. Take tests faster.

GALAXY GOAL

It helps you hear and remember sounds. It also helps you pay attention to detail and focus for longer periods. It will help you build your memory.

SPIN MASTER

This will help you hear sounds more accurately. This makes reading easier.

LUNAR TUNES

This will help you build your memory, especially for sounds. It will help you remember what you are hearing and reading.

STELLAR STORIES

This will build language skills and attention to detail. It will also help build your memory.

STAR PICS

This will help your listening accuracy by picking out the small changes between words and slow, then faster speeds. Once your brain hears the differences it will be able to read with much less effort.
